HOMEWARD BOUND

Nearly all of the articles about HSOV dogs and cats which appear in our newsletters feature shelter pets who have found homes after being adopted locally or transported to rescue groups. We naturally love sharing those happy "feel good" stories © As our newsletter editor was looking over the 2017 HSOV statistics, she realized that there are many other happy stories which are reflected by the 'Reclaimed' figures. The HSOV makes every effort to reunite pets with their families and last year a total of 186 dogs and 16 cats went back home. So far in 2018, there have been 44 dogs and 6 cats reclaimed and one kitty released. We've chosen two of those happy Homeward Bound stories with the note that sometimes "home" is not always with a traditional family (as in the case of Kitty Downspout) 🙂



A sweet senior female Australian Cattle Dog (whom we posted as Mandy) was picked up in the Little Hocking Ohio area by HSOV Humane Officer Jon McIntire on March 9, 2018. This little 'damsel in distress' had been stuck by an automobile and was immediately taken to a local veterinarian. Fortunately she did not suffer any broken bones but was surely traumatized by the accident. Mandy was given nice warm blankets and kept in a quiet room for observation when she returned to

the shelter. HSOV Supervisor Rennelle Casto gave this little girl

extra TLC and comforted her. Mandy appeared to have impaired vision due to cataracts and she was most likely deaf \otimes We posted her pictures on our facebook pages and lo-and-behold someone recognized her and contacted her family! Mandy's mom and dad came to take her home on March 11, 2018. They told us that her real name was Shiloh and that she was actually 26-years old (and no that is not a typo). By some miracle, little Shiloh had wandered nearly one mile from her home and lived to tell about her adventure [©] Needless to say, there wasn't a dry eye in the



shelter when staff and volunteers heard Shiloh's amazing tale of survival

This big orange tabby kitty (whom we just had to name **Downspout**) was fortunate when a Good Samaritan happened to be walking her dog at Muskingum Park in Marietta Ohio on February

9, 2018. It seemed that he must have found something very intriguing inside a plastic downspout and his head became lodged in the end of the drain pipe. The Good Samaritan quickly called HSOV Humane Officer Jon McIntire, and kitty was taken to the HSOV along with the two-foot section of the downspout (where the drain pipe was removed). Unfortunately we don't have a photo so you will have to use your imagination ⁽²⁾ Kitty rested comfortably at the shelter and was neutered on February 14, 2018. Downspout was taken back to his former neighborhood a few days later and has been seen enjoying the lifestyle to which



he had become accustomed (including daily food service by kind residents in that area). Thanks to the Good Samaritan who found Downspout with the drain pipe stuck on his head and quickly called Humane Officer McIntire, Downspout had a happy ending to his ordeal 💛 💛

Just visit the website, follow the instructions, and enter NPO Number 93001 or the name 'Humane Society of the Ohio Valley' and confirm. You must swipe your registered Kroger Plus Card when shopping for your purchases in order to benefit the shelter. The HSOV is given a percentage of sales purchased by registered card holders. We usually received a yearly income of \$5,000-\$6,000 thanks to our HSOV Kroger Shoppers ^(c)

There are usually seven residents in the Senior Cat Room, which is located adjacent to the lobby of our shelter. We rejoice when any of the senior kitties find a home of their own, and we are happy to report that 2018 is looking like the *"Year of The Senior HSOV Cats"* since many have been adopted during the first four months of 2018 ^(C) When one senior kitty is adopted, that opens up space for another to be accepted into the group (usually with open paws from the other residents).

We celebrate the good fortune of these thirteen special seniors (Carla, Heather Rose, Jasmine, Midnight, Mojo, Ms Kitty, Peanut, Raven, Snow White, Socks, Sookie, Sophie, and Sulkie) and extend a special THANK YOU to the adopters who opened up their hearts and gave a loving home to an older cat

We have chosen five of those recent adoptees to highlight with this article:

CARLA was a senior brown tabby of indeterminate age who arrived at the HSOV June 7, 2016 She had definitely fallen on hard times and was very frail, yet maintained her sweet personality. Carla was always the first to come running to the door in the Senior Room when dinner was served ☺ Carla was adopted April 22, 2018 by a young lady who adores her. Carla is being loved unconditionally and is addicted to her morning saucer of cream ☺☺

ROCHELLE was a senior white/brown tabby who came to the HSOV on January 11, 2018 because her owner had passed away. Rochelle was adopted on April 20, 2018 and now has a career as an assistant in a financial counseling office. We've been told that Rochelle sleeps on the job a lot and that is actually included in her job description ⁽²⁾ Three of Rochelle's friends (Roma, Rowena, and Rufus) are still in the Senior Room waiting for a home.

SOCKS was a 16-year old black/white Tuxedo kitty who arrived at HSOV on February 23, 2017 with several of her friends after their mistress passed away. Socks' best friend (14-year old **Peanut**) was adopted December 18, 2017. Socks was adopted May 5, 2018 at the age of 17-years ^(C)

SOOKIE was an 11-year old gray tabby who was surrendered on May 6, 2017 along with her companions (Jasmine, Raven, and Sulkie) because their owner was moving and couldn't take them along ⁽²⁾ Sookie LOVED the tall cat tree in the Senior Room. She had become a full-figured girl but was still the senior who was most often seen on the highest perch (sometimes taking a catnap and often bird-watching out the window). Sookie was adopted April 27, 2018 at the age of 12-years old. Jasmine and Raven were adopted on February 10, 2018 with Heather Rose as a 'trio' by a compassionate couple who drove several hours and specifically wanted to adopt senior kitties ⁽²⁾

SULKIE was an 11-year old dilute calico who was surrendered with Jasmine, Raven, and Sookie) on May 6, 2017 because their owner was moving. Sulkie's 'claim to fame' was her passion for bellyrubs. Kelly was a beautiful 2-year old female Pointer/Pit Bull Terrier mix who had arrived at the HSOV on January 13, 2017 as a transfer from a nearby county whose facility was deemed unsafe for housing Kelly and four other dogs. Her four companions each found homes quickly, but we were privileged to share Kelly's life for nearly a year \heartsuit

This gorgeous young lady had a sleek red-and-white short smooth coat, a long tail, and an adorable red-and-white face which was symmetrically marked. Kelly had a liver-colored nose and extra-large semi-erect ears (the better to hear you with my dear) \bigcirc Kelly had a real zest for life and was always ready to have a good time. She loved to romp and play ball with volunteers in our large play yards and to splash in the small swimming pool there in the summertime. We knew that she loved her people friends but didn't think she tolerated cats in her world (little did we know how mistaken we were about that) \bigcirc

Kelly had the distinction of being the longest resident in our shelter, and it appeared that she would be celebrating her one-year anniversary with us on January 13, 2018. We'd like to believe that a 'Christmas Miracle' took place on the afternoon of December 20th. Little did Kelly know that morning her life was about to change dramatically. The Smith Family came to HSOV later that afternoon and were looking for a special dog to share their lives with in time for Christmas. When they searched for shelters within a reasonable distance of their home, the HSOV appeared to be the "in" place for adopting a great dog. They spent time with HSOV Kennel Tech Maranda Markwood as she introduced them to several of our dogs, and it was Kelly who won their hearts Kelly waited patiently for the adoption paperwork to be completed, and we took quick photos as we said good-bye to Kelly and wished her happiness in her new home. We hoped that Kelly's new family would post updates on facebook about her, and we were thrilled when her new 'momma' (*Lisa Marie Smith*) posted a photo on December 26, 2017 with the caption "Kelly is doing great! She is watching the boys play video games." (We've shared that photo with this story)

On March 23, 2018, *Lisa Marie Smith* posted a surprising update about Kelly. She was pictured with a tiny kitten named Nugget, and Kelly was assuming the role of its new mommy!!

We asked Lisa Marie if she would be willing to share her personal story about Kelly to include with our feature article in this newsletter, and she quickly responded with this heartfelt message:

"My father went to the Marietta shelter in hopes of finding his daughter (me) and son-in-law a dog for Christmas, and he found Kelly. She is a great dog. Kelly has come a long way from what I've been told. She didn't get along with cats at the shelter, and now i think she believes she IS a cat. She is so loving with a big heart and has adopted me, my fiancée, our four children, and her grandpa. Kelly is not just a dog. She is one of our kids 🙂 We love her so much. She is very spoiled and gets to sleep with the kids or with me. She also keeps a watchful eye on our 6-year old son who has epilepsy. Kelly is with him constantly and sleeps with him. I truly believe if he were to have a seizure that Kelly will let us know. Kelly loves her cat 'sisters' and loves to play with them. She gives the baby kitten a bath and seems to believe it is her baby. To think that no one believed she would get along with $cats \odot \odot$ Kelly is amazing, and she has an open heart and is so loving. I believe Kelly was just the right fit for our family. Thank you all for your work with Kelly. She is so great because of the team of people who loved her and worked with her. And it paid off in a big way" 👥

These sessions won't necessarily be held every Sunday and will be scheduled according to Richard and Carrie's availability.

In summary, new volunteers must attend General Orientation (including Cat and Dog Handling) with Linda Perry. You will be required to complete a "Three Shadows And You're In" before being presented with your official HSOV Volunteer Badge & Lanyard. This involves three separate 'shadowing' sessions with an experienced dog walker before walking dogs on your own. This gives new volunteers a little more confidence



in handling dogs and also gives you the opportunity to become acquainted with fellow volunteers. You will subsequently be asked to attend a special Dog Handling Session conducted by Richard Long or Carrie Roe

We can also schedule General Orientation on an alternate day if Sundays are inconvenient. Ginger Eubank, Julie Lowther, Amy Rogers, and Beth Underwood are always willing and eager to provide orientation sessions for new volunteers as well 🙂

In many shelters cats who test positive are routinely euthanized and become a 'statistic' ^(C) We are thankful and proud that HSOV seeks to find a home for them



instead, and we are especially thankful for rescues who help when local homes are not found. We are celebrating their lives as we tell the stories of these three special kitties ...

Grayson was a handsome 3-year old male kitty who was brought to the HSOV on August 22, 2017. This good-looking guy had a white-and-gray coat, a long tail, and a cute chubby face with a pink nose and hopeful trusting eyes that begged for attention. Grayson was listed as a 'Special Needs Cat' since he



had tested positive for FIV (*Feline Immunodeficiency Virus*) prior to coming to HSOV. We included this bit of information in Grayson's description (and decided to reprint it with

this article for educational purposes) .. "A vigilant pet owner who treats secondary infections can assist an FIV-infected cat to live a reasonably long life. The chances that an FIV-infected cat will pass the virus to other cats within a household are slim to none if no serious fighting or biting occurs."

Grayson was definitely a lover and not a fighter, so we had high hopes that he would be adopted after we had him neutered on October 26th. Grayson waited patiently all winter long for someone to fall in love with him and take him home. Since that didn't happen, we took updated photos on February 28, 2018 which featured Grayson "pussyfooting' around in our studio and showing off his big lovable self © Although he didn't find a local home, Grayson did receive terrific news a few weeks later when he was accepted by a fabulous rescue! Serendipity was a beautiful 2-year old female Calico/Manx kitty who made her debut at the HSOV on January 1, 2018 after a Good Samaritan found her in the Marietta Ohio area.
