
As we approach the end of the calendar year 2021, it is nice to reflect on the past twelve months and set goals for the new year ahead...

A long-anticipated project (and a dream for our HSOV cat cages) became a reality when 'Cat Portals' were installed on August 18-19, 2021 in adjoining cages in our Jungle Room (where the majority of our adoptable cats are housed)

These cat portals join two (and sometimes three) cages together so that our larger cats and bonded pairs of cats/kittens have more space (and separate 'bathroom facilities'). The portals have the capability of being closed off since there is a plastic plate which can easily be placed over the opening, and the cages can be changed back to single smaller cages when need be.

Some 'sneak preview' photos were taken late in the afternoon on Wednesday August 18th and show a few of our kitties already enjoying extra space (and the added 'fun' of jumping through the portals) Unstallation of additional portals was underway bright and early on the following day and also included some cages in our Isolation Room.

Thanks to *T. Cline Construction (Newport OH)* for donating their time and expertise to install the portals (which required precision cutting/drilling to align openings between cages). T. Cline Construction even made a generous donation to our shelter after completing the project.


This bonded pair of best friends (Marley and Shelby) were surrendered to the HSOV by their family on May 27, 2021. Marley and Shelby had been in their previous home since they were 6-8 week old puppies, so their whole world was turned upside down when they suddenly found themselves sharing a kennel in a shelter environment \square





Marley was a handsome 7-year old neutered male Labrador Retriever/Rottweiler mix. He had a black short smooth coat with brindle highlights, a long tail, and a sweet innocent-looking face with expressive brown eyes, brindle shading on his muzzle/eyebrows, and short floppy ears. Marley was a big boy who weighed 63 lbs. Marley had a quiet, very timid, personality.








other children but Shelby could not be trusted to be nice to cats (especially small kittens).



We knew that Marley and Shelby could not be separated and that it was in their best interest to be adopted together.





HSOV Kennel Tech *Lauryn Hamilton* was anxious to accompany them outdoors for their updated photos together but noted that Marley had a scheduled appointment with a local veterinarian that morning. Little Shelby was nervous when Marley was taken from their shared kennel and attempted to go with him for moral support.

Lauryn later sent a text message with regard to Marley's appointment (and I'm sure she was texting while crying) and reported that the diagnosis/prognosis was not good. Marley had a growth on his hip which the vet believed might be an aggressive form of cancer. If the cancer was not spreading, Marley would undergo surgery to remove it .. But if it was spreading, Marley would be monitored for quality of life and difficult decisions would be made ...

We began a campaign find a compassionate individual or family who would offer Marley and Shelby a foster home together so that Marley would not have to spend the rest of whatever time he had left in a shelter kennel. And we knew that poor little Shelby would be devastated and heartbroken without Marley when/ if he was no longer with us :

We were 'over-the-moon' happy when a local husband-and-wife completed an HSOV foster/adoption application and came to meet Marley and Shelby on December 2nd ... When asked if they wanted to give Marley and Shelby a temporary home, we were delighted when they replied that "there was no way it would be temporary" and when they offered them a home, it would be a permanent lifetime package deal \bigcirc

That wonderful couple brought Marley back on December 7th so that he could spend the evening with us and be transported bright and early the next morning for his surgery appointment. We waited 'on pins and needles' until we heard the report from the veterinarian who performed the surgical procedure to remove the mass/growth on Marley's hip ... And breathed a huge sigh of relief when she reported that 'all went well'

Our hearts were happy when Marley's new 'mom and dad' came back the following afternoon to take him HOME (where Shelby was anxiously awaiting a reunion with Marley). Somehow this seemed like an early Christmas miracle for Marley and Shelby

RENO FIREMAN RESCUES HSOY CAT FROM TREE

There was a 'true-to-life' story which took place at the HSOV shortly before noon on September 24, 2021 and resembled a familiar script from a movie scene ..

Our shelter was over capacity for housing cats (like most shelters were at that time), and we had an unfortunate incident due to not having space to accept another cat • Sadly the owner became visibly upset and abandoned her very frightened cat in our parking lot and drove away • • •

The frightened cat ran across the parking lot and climbed one of the tall trees nearby. Thank goodness our closest neighbor at HSOV happens to be the Marietta Township/Reno Ohio Volunteer Fire Department.

Our shelter staff contacted them, and a volunteer fireman responded

quickly to the proverbial 'HELP .. my cat is stuck in a tree' call and came to rescue the kitty.

But the story gets even more dramatic .. The fireman reached the kitty as our HSOV kennel techs/staff waited beneath the tree with a large blanket. He was able to grab the kitty with his hands and dropped her into the blanket below

In the midst of the drama, we did not get the name of the anonymous hero who responded and rescued the kitty, but our feline kennel techs did ask him for permission to take his photo along with the rescued kitty to post on our facebook pages in order to show our thanks for his kindness and willingness to help a kitty in distress



That super hero was later identified as *Tanner Thompson*, and we were able to acknowledge and thank him properly soon afterwards on our HSOV Facebook pages. Tanner is not on Facebook, but we hope that you will thank him personally and recognize his act of kindness.

We would imagine that HSOV Kennel Tech (*Kati Rankin*) who had snapped this photo and helped to catch the falling cat in the safety net (i.e., large blanket) along with her co-workers are still shaking when they recall the experience!

Our kennel techs chose the name *Timber* for the rescued kitty after she was safely in our shelter. Timber was a beautiful 5-month old mediumhaired black kitten who had a cute chubby face with large golden eyes that begged for attention. She had a sweet personality and loved to be held in your arms. Timber was given extra TLC in addition to vaccines and was combo tested. She was a petite little lady who weighed just 4 lbs. Timber was spayed on October 5, 2021 and, like all good Hallmark movies, there was a happy fairy-tale ending for this lucky kitten ..

2022 WASHINGTON COUNTY OHIO DOG LICENSES

Residents of Washington County Ohio are reminded that you must purchase a 2022 license for your dog by January 31, 2022. The Ohio Revised Code Section 955.010.05 mandates that all dogs over 3-months old must be licensed by January 31st or 30 days after the dog becomes 3-months old. Penalties apply after the January 31st deadline.

Licenses are available at the Washington County Auditor's Office, 205 Putnam Street, Marietta OH (Monday-Friday 8:00am-5:00pm) either in person or by mail for a cost of \$16.00 plus postage. They may also be purchased online

at www.doglicenses.us/OH/Washington (credit card payments only/processing fees apply). Three-year (\$48.00) and Permanent Licenses (\$160.00) may also be purchased through the Auditor's Office.

You may also purchase 2022 dog licenses/tags at the HSOV (Tuesday-Saturday 11:00am-5:00pm and Sunday Noon-3:00pm) for a cost of \$16.75.

Having a current dog tag on your dog's collar is very important to help reunite you and your beloved pet in the event that he/she becomes lost and is brought to our shelter or picked up the Washington County Ohio Dog Warden.

An online database (which includes dog tag numbers from 2020-present) also makes it possible for individuals to locate the owner of a lost dog who is wearing a tag. That database can be accessed on the www.doglicenses.us/OH/Washington website under "License Searches".
